<p>Overview of Unit or Service</p>	<p>Please outline the role of the unit and range of clinical services provided</p> <p>The specialty of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery specialty is involved in the management of diseases, injuries, defects in the head, face, jaws, hard and soft tissues of the mouth The Department of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at Westmead Hospital is a tertiary referral unit and uniquely functions at the interface of Medicine and Dentistry. The department is the largest training center in NSW OMS Training Program with 7 consultants, 4 accredited registrars, and 1 unaccredited registrar.</p> <p>Please outline the patient case mix, turnover and how acutely ill the patients generally are</p> <p>The scope of surgical services provided includes: Facial Trauma, Cervicofacial infection,,Dento-facial Deformity and Orthognathic Surgery, Facial Reconstruction, Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology, Tempormandibular disorders, Dental Implantology, Dento-alveolar surgery.</p> <p>There are 7 dedicated OMFS operating sessions per week coupled with 7 Surgery outpatient clinics and 4 minor procedure suites. Between emergency admissions to ICU/HDU, elective admissions and day-surgery, the unit attends to on average 50 to 60 patients per week excluding outpatient reviews and consultations.</p>
