

## E-LEARNING FOR INTERNS (& RMOS)



All NSW Health Employees are expected to complete Mandatory e-learning, which is done on line through the “My Health Learning” Website (<http://www.ehealth.nsw.gov.au/programs/corporate/mhl>)

This site both hosts all the e-learning modules and also maintains your own personal record of e-learning, as well as face to face learning, which you will retain throughout your public hospital employment.

JMOs can access My Health Learning from any computer within the hospital, or externally via the internet from your home computer, phone or device.

When you first log in and look at “My Current Learning”, (Under My learning) it should display all of the modules which you are expected to complete. The mandatory courses are indicated by a red or blue flag.

**Please note that if you had access to My Health Learning prior to starting internship, your account may be configured inappropriately and displaying a different set of red and blue flags.** The complete list of modules which you are expected to complete is overleaf and these are the ones we expect you to complete.

They can be summarised as follows

- There are 5 modules which are mandatory for all Medical Staff - These form the “Medical Officers Mandatory Training Pathway”. These can be attempted individually or all five can be signed off at once if you successfully complete the Mandatory Training Challenge Test. While this sounds like a short cut it should be noted that this test is very difficult to pass.
- In addition there are a further 10 courses which have been defined as mandatory for all JMOs which should have either a red or a blue flag against them.
- Lastly, interns are required to complete the Medical Intern Learning Pathway. However, because we cover most of these topics during intern orientation the only outstanding topic which you need to worry about is BloodSafe: Clinical Transfusion Practice which has an orange flag

You will notice a number of other modules with Orange pins, and these have been flagged for your interest but (with the single exception noted above) are not mandatory.

All **interns** will be rostered to a day off to complete their mandatory e-learning during their relief term. This is designated as HETI-MT on your relief roster. Your e-learning can be done from wherever you choose as long as it is done. If you have already completed all your mandatory e-learning prior to this rostered day, you will still be paid and you should use the time furthering your personal medical education

Your progress will be audited and you will be reminded if, after having been rostered to your Mandatory e-learning day, you still have modules outstanding.
